The role of empathy and understanding in design.

The principles of designing enabling environments for people with dementia are generally known but the fact is that numerous buildings and products are designed which do not meet their needs. One possible explanation is a lack of real empathy and understanding from designers. The talk will outline the key characteristics of enabling design and will explain how the Virtual Reality Empathy Platform (VR-EP) will assist in achieving a real understanding of why they are so important.

Creating my space: how to get a personal space in a standardised modular building.

Mark and Jeff will look at how to manage a mixed portfolio of medium and low secure and locked rehab units, looking at how the management and standardisation needs to be tempered to allow for personalisation to assist recovery rather than standardisation just as a money saving device. They will focus on environmental treatments both in personal and communal spaces, and how modifying the space to suit the patients likes/dislikes through simple treatments using lighting and art can help with transition and give a feeling of familiarisation.



Presentation will look at the achievements of the client/architect 15 year partnership of Northumberland, Tyne & Wear NHS FT and Medical Architecture culminating in over 20 design awards.

The shifting landscape of support and empowerment.

For good reasons and bad, it is becoming imperative that we support people with mental health conditions to stay out of hospitals and be supported closer to home.

Designing for people with dementia: theory and reality.

The presentation will outline the different types of dementia and their effects, introduce design principles and features and explore how these can be applied in "real life" health and social care environments. Using case studies from several existing facilities and feedback from staff and residents who live and use the facilities, lessons learnt and emphasis on good dementia design and legislative and operational issues and how to resolve any conflicts.



The presentation will focus on the Dementia Concept Home which is based upon dementia innovative research undertaken by Liverpool John Moores University, Halsall Lloyd partnership, Mersey healthcare, the SURF group and Dementia Action Alliance. The research is unique using a living laboratory of people with dementia who helped build a model and design guide for dementia through a process of sandpits. BREEAM were committed to build the model at Innovation Park at Watford, and with funding from Loughborough University the 2 bedroom Victorian model house will be delivered by late autumn 2017.
